hugulu primary school was built in 1935 by the Nkhoma Synod of CCAP. By then the School had only two classrooms. Some learners were learning under the tree. The school is situated along M5 Road about 200M from the main road at Nkhwidzi trading centre in Salima district. It is found in Ngodzi Zone.

Currently the School has ten classrooms but one classroom is used as the head teacher's office and part of it is used as the staff room.

The school has over one thousand learners and the current number of teachers is at twelve including the head teacher.


There are only five teacher's house at the school. This means that only five teachers stays at the school.


